Join us for a special screening of *Hale County This Morning, This Evening* (2018), a new film by RaMell Ross that express the reality of individuals whose public image, lives, and humanity originate in exploitation. This lyrical film boldly ruptures the racist aesthetic frameworks that have historically constricted the expression of African American men on film.

This event also marks the launch of *No Mud, No Lotus*, a fourteen-week retrospective of the work of Louverture Films. Co-founded by actor Danny Glover and film producer Joslyn Barnes, Louverture Films takes its name and inspiration from the leader of the Haitian Revolution, Toussaint Louverture—famous for always creating an “opening” in the face of enormous obstacles.
